Honourable Chief Guest, Advocate Madhavi Goradia Divan, Additional Solicitor General of India in the Supreme Court of India, Professor Balaganapathi Devarakonda, Chairperson, Governing Body, our special invitee, Mr. Sanjay Kansal, my colleagues and dear students. It is a matter of great privilege and pride for me to extend a heartiest welcome to all on the 52nd Annual Day of Maitreyi College.

Advocate Madhavi Goradia Divan currently holds the position of Additional Solicitor General of India in the Supreme Court of India. She was recently designated a senior advocate by the Supreme Court of India where she has practiced since 2007 on a range of subjects which include constitutional law, media law and environment law. She holds a degree in law from Cambridge University where she was a Cambridge Commonwealth Scholar. Prior to 2007 she was based in Mumbai where she practiced as a counsel before the Bombay High Court and had a largely commercial law practice. She has also appeared pro bono in several public causes which involve environmental issues, gender rights, child rights and rights of the visually challenged. She has represented the Government of India in several landmark constitutional cases in the Supreme Court including the Triple Talaq case and the NJAC case on judges' appointments.

Advocate Divan is the author of a leading book on media law titled "Facets of Media Law", now in its second edition. The book is widely used by practitioners and media persons and is a recommended text book in several law schools across India.

Apart from her law book, Ms. Divan regularly writes for leading law journals and newspapers. She is the editor of The Indian Advocate, a journal published by the Bar Association of India. She has been a guest lecturer at several law colleges across India and has participated in several law conferences as a speaker on media law and gender rights.

Prof. Balaganapathi Devarakonda is presently Professor & Head, Department of Philosophy in the University of Delhi. He has many publications in the areas of Political Philosophy and Contemporary Understanding of Indian Philosophy including *Hobbesian Philosophy Still Sways* (2011), *Globalisation, Multiculturalism and the International Order* (edited) *Proceedings of the 8th International Congress of Social Philosophy* (2009) and *Social and Political Philosophers of Modern Andhra* (2006). Prof. Devarakonda also holds positions of relevance in multiple organizations and constituted bodies associated with academics and research. He is the Editor-in-Chief of International Journal of Applied Ethics and has contributions to various other national and international journals and publications. He is presently a Member of the Committee constituted by UGC, New Delhi for drafting 'Learning Outcomes based Curriculum Framework' (LOCF) for Philosophy (2018).

Mr Sanjay Kansal completed his B.E. Mechanical from NIT Durgapur and his MBA from IMT Ghaziabad. He is a prominent entrepreneur who started his own Design & Development based company for manufacturing of import substitutes special purpose CNC and Robotic Equipment over 25 years ago. He also co-founded an educational and training institute aimed at imparting short skill training courses to bridge the gap between industry needs and extant capabilities. He is actively involved with the India Against Corruption movement since its inception.

Maitreyi College, an integral part of Delhi University's federal structure, came into existence in the year 1967 to impart higher education to women. It is no coincidence that the college bears the name of 'Maitreyi', an eminent scholar and sage of the Vedic period who symbolized an exemplary balance between tradition and modernity. It has been our endeavour to translate these ideals into our education system and represent the best of both the worlds - material and spiritual. In this college, we not only lay emphasis on the dissemination of knowledge but also on the cultivation of personality. We have an established a continuous tradition of achievements in Academics, Sports, N.C.C. and other cultural activities.



Maitreyi College, like preceding years, retained excellence in Academics. A total of 3268 students appeared in the Annual Examination and 1937 students obtained I Division, 851 students obtained II Division and 145 students obtained III Division. The overall pass percentage was 89.74%. Nearly all Science Departments achieved 100% pass percentage in their final year.

To recognize and reward student achievements, from this year two initiatives have been taken. A scholarship in the name of Prof. B.L. Sharma has been initiated by his daughter Ms. Rashmi Verma Retd. Faculty Member from English Department under which a fee waiver of Rs. 3000 is given to 18 students. In addition an award has also been instituted by Dr. Saroj Chawla from Hindi Department in the name of 'Late Smt. Lajwnati Chawla and Shri Nand Lal Chawla' for meritorious students.

Our faculty members continued to earn laurels for the college through their multi-faceted achievements in teaching, academics and cultural activities. Dr. Mala Kapur Shankardass from Sociology was awarded the Best Teacher Award by the Delhi Government Directorate of Higher Education in March 2019. Dr. Pramod Kumar Singh from the Department of Sanskrit received the "National Award (Rashtriya Puraskar)" under Best Employee Category from Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi. The award was given by Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu, the Honourable Vice President of India. He was also awarded the "Dr. Ambedkar Sahityashree National Award-2018" by BDS Academy, New Delhi in December, 2018.

Ms. Smriti Singh, Department of English was awarded by the 'Badte Kadam NGO' for her contributions for the upliftment of slum women on March 8, International Women's Day. Ms. Priyanka Nirupam from the Department of History received the Kala Pratibha Award for her contribution to Kuchipudi. She also received the National Nritya Shiromani Award at Cuttak Mahotsava, Odisha.

Dr. Geeta Pandey from the Department of Hindi was awarded the Kriti Sammaan 2019 for her book titled 'Gandhivaad evam Hindi Natak' by the Guggan Ram Educational and Social Welfare Society Bohal, Bhiwani.

Dr. Renu Gupta from the Department of Zoology was awarded a three-month post-doctoral scholarship by the Austrian Agency for International Cooperation in Education & Research, Centre for International Cooperation & Mobility (ICM) to work at Institut für Limnologie, Mondsee, Austria. Dr. Mala Kapur Shankardass began her association with the National Ageing Research Centre Melbourne, as a Fellow for work on elder abuse and other gerontological issues.

Besides this, our faculty members authored 11 books, contributed 15 chapters in edited collections and anthologies and published close to 60 research papers.

To promote advanced research in academics, two Departments from our college organised national level conferences. The Department of Commerce conducted a national Faculty Development Program titled "Research: Problem Formulation and Analysis" while the Department of Botany organised a National Conference on "Trends in Life Sciences & Biotechnology: Innovative Paradigms".

Our students displayed the same rigour towards research publications as a total of five magazines were released this year. Samvedna, an initiative by the Internal Committee for Complaints, is a University level bilingual e-magazine with articles, poems and research papers contributed by students and scholars from national and international universities. Neeti, also a University level publication and the annual magazine of the Department of Economics was launched this year. Similarly, students from the Departments of English, Hindi and Sociology showcased their creative and research skills in their respective Departmental magazines/newsletters titled *Dialectic*, *Maitreyi Kriti* and *Sociologue: Aao Baat Karein* respectively.

I am very pleased to announce that this year was marked by the beginning of several new academic initiatives.

In the year 2018, Maitreyi College instituted its research cell known as “Advisory Committee for Professional Grooming (ACPG)”. With an aim to inculcate research and analytical skills in our students and create a research friendly environment, we launched the Summer Internship Program. Under this program, close to 60 students worked under the guidance of faculty members for two months and completed 24 research projects, 17 from Humanities and 7 from Sciences. These projects were financially supported by the college. After the completion of the projects, they were presented in front of eminent experts who judged the projects on various criteria.

To promote learning outside the classroom, we initiated the practice of conducting One Day Educational Excursions. During the mid-semester break, approximately 1500 students benefited from these excursions as they learnt industrial practices and witnessed the application of their respective educational curricula.

In an attempt to use technology to bridge the gap between disciplines, the college developed a unique event in the form of Avgaahan, a first of its kind interdisciplinary academic fest. This unique platform provided students with the opportunity to engage with various disciplines through online and offline competitions like e-poster making, creative writing, case studies, coding, photo essays, quiz, debate etc. We received more than 2000 registrations from national and international universities and 58 students were awarded cash prizes.

At Maitreyi, we constantly strive to enhance our students’ skill set and improve their employability opportunities. As a part of this commitment, we offer Certificate and Diploma courses in French and Spanish and short term courses in Journalism and Web-Designing. Currently, 114 students are enrolled in these courses. Additionally, the NSS unit, in collaboration with Sri Satya Sai organization, introduced a short term certificate course on soft skills titled ‘Life is a game, play it’. This course was offered free of cost and was successfully completed by 33 students.

Adding to the series of new initiatives, the Placement Cell of the college organised the first ever Internship cum Placement Fair, Envision 2019. The fair enabled students to network with companies, identify potential job opportunities and enhance their professional communication skills. Approximately 1400 students registered, out of which 150 students were offered internship and job opportunities. Over the course of the year, more than 70 companies and NGOs visited the college and conducted recruitment drives.

In order to provide a learning platform to budding women entrepreneurs of our college, Meraki, the Entrepreneurship Cell was established in 2019. As a part of its operations, 30 students participated in a skill-based workshop organized by IE Business School, Spain conducted in college premises. Our college was one of the five colleges of DU where the workshop was conducted by the IE Business school.

As an organisation, we are equally committed to fulfilling our social responsibility to our community and environment. The NSS wing has 130 active volunteers who conducted many dynamic activities. As a part of its outreach program, the NSS wing adopted five villages across India - Taraiya Chhapra (Bihar), Jivwana Guliyana (Uttar Pradesh, Near Meerut), Dakpathar (Uttarakhand), Digghi (Jharkhand) and Dibrugarh (Assam). It also adopted three old age homes viz. Sandhya Senior Citizen Old Age Home, Godhuli Old Age Home and Vardaan Senior Citizen Centre in Delhi NCR where 40 volunteers spent time with old people. A kids carnival-Navoudit was held by NSS, in collaboration with Youth for Seva, which witnessed the participation of 1500 slum students from age of 8 to 14 yrs from all over Delhi NCR.

The NSS wing also participated in the campaign held by North West Delhi Election commission, Electoral Literacy Club, at Jesus and Mary College and won ‘Best College Award’ for spreading awareness about electoral process. On the eve of NSS Day, a workshop was held in collaboration with two NGOs, Youth for Seva and Bharat Uday, to sensitize students for volunteership. As a part of the initiative “Swachata hi Sewa Hai” by the government of India, NSS volunteers performed “Swachata Pakhwara” by cleaning the college premises and a

The Enabling Unit organised a one-week interdisciplinary Faculty Development Programme on “Disabilities Studies : Perspectives and Emerging Trends” in collaboration with TLC, Ramanujan College. This was the first FDP in India on the area of disability and was attended by 57 teachers from various universities. It also collaborated with the Department of Physical Education to establish “Sashakt Nodal Sports Centre for PwDs (Persons with Disabilities). Under this initiative, wheel-bound players of national and international repute attend basketball practices in the synthetic basketball court in college premises. They are assisted by the following student volunteers – Sapna, Renu, Varsha, Sneha and Vrinda.

Team Enactus also contributed to the societal cause by organizing various campaigns such as ‘Daan Utsav’ in collaboration with Goonj, spray painting competition for specially-abled children of Anukriti School, and awareness drive on World Toilet Day in association with Sulabh School Sanitation Club. The first ever Enactus Festival was successfully conducted by team Enactus Maitreyi in the college premises. It saw participation from over 40 teams and 200+ business enthusiasts from DU.

The efforts of the Eco-Club were rewarded as the college won the Plastic Free College of the Year Award-2018 on occasion of World Environment Day at National Environment Convention-2018 organized by Indian Institute of Ecology and Environment and National Institute of Cleanliness Education and Research.

At Maitreyi, we strive towards adopting sustainable and self-sufficient means. Besides maintaining herbal gardens, we have also developed vermicomposting facilities wherein bio-waste from the canteen is used to produce manure. We have also collaborated with an NGO for recycling of paper. The saplings that are used to felicitate our guests are grown in our very own gardens.

It is a matter of great pride that the college won The Deshabndhu Cup and The Persian Cup for best lawn and garden among all colleges of Delhi University at the Delhi University Annual Flower Show 2019. Shri Jageshwar from college received the Best Maali award in 2019.

Our achievements in academics were supplemented by the exceptional accomplishments of our talented students in cultural and extra-curricular fields. The annual cultural festival Rhapsody was a resounding success and witnessed widespread participation from colleges across Delhi.

Abhivyakti, the theatre society of the college, produced and performed a stage play titled “Coverage Chalu Hai” and a street play titled ‘Viral’. They secured multiple positions in Inter-University competitions, including Best Direction and Production at IIT Kanpur and first position at IIT Delhi. Galore, the fashion society, performed their show on the theme “People, not Labels” and secured first position in seven inter-college competitions, while Nrityakriti bagged eight first positions across DU. Riyaz, the India music society, won first prizes in seven reputed colleges of Delhi University.

Students from Trenchant, the debate society of the college, won Best Speaker Awards in many conventional debates and 3 Best Adjudicator Awards in parliamentary debates. Zeal, the Western Dance Society and Apollonia, the Western Music society also won first prizes for their individual and group performances. Students from Vista, the photography society, held an exhibition during Rhapsody that displayed the creativity and skill of their photographers. Artisto, the Fine Arts society of the college, also exhibited approximately 35 paintings and art works made by their members in college. In fact, all paintings given as welcome gifts to our guests are made by the very talented students of Artisto.

A three day inter college sports festival, Aagaz, was organised which was attended by approximately 60 teams and 600 players of basketball, badminton, football etc.

The Alumni association organized Sannidhy-the annual Alumni Meet to celebrate the achievements of our illustrious alumni and to welcome them back into the Maitreyi *kutumb*. It was a source of immense pleasure for us to felicitate 11 alumni members including Ms. Latika Nath, ‘The Tiger Princess’ who is the first woman wildlife biologist in India to hold a doctorate on tigers, Ms. Siva Kapoor, an independent wellness advocate is an entrepreneur based in USA who is associated with Santhigram wellness Ayurveda and Major Nupur Gupta, a retired army officer with 25 years of experience in teaching, training and leadership development.

The non-teaching faculty has always been the supporting pillars of our organisation. For the first time, our college cricket team participated in Delhi University Staff Club Cricket Tournament and stood second among 11 teams. Several members of the non-teaching staff also presented papers at conferences and attended workshops. Through their many endeavours, they contributed substantially towards the successfully functioning of the college.

The College bid farewell to Dr. Amritha Anand, Dr. Ramesh Mandhan, Dr. Sadhana Pandey, Dr. Vishnu Priya and Mrs. Yogam Datta. They superannuated after successfully completing their teaching tenure.

I would like to end with a note of thanks to our Chief Guest Advocate Madhavi Goradia Divan, Prof. Balaganapathi Devarakonda, Chairperson, Governing Body and Mr. Sanjay Kansal, our special invitee, for gracing the occasion and giving us their valuable time. I would also like to thank the teaching and non-teaching staff and students for their cooperation and support in organizing this function.

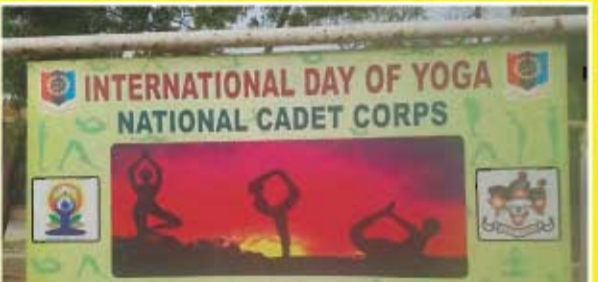

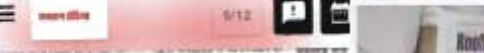

continues to be the member of DELNET (Developing Library Network) which specially cater our need through Inter Library Loan. Library has created its own Institutional Repository using DSPACE software which is accessible in the library only. Library users can access the previous and current year syllabus through Maitreyi College Library Repository. The college library has conducted Information Literacy programs course wise for the students admitted in 2018.

SUMMER INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME

In the year 2018, Maitreyi College instituted its research cell known as “Advisory Committee for Professional Grooming (ACPG)”. This is a statutory body under the University of Delhi. The primary aim of the committee is to promote and develop research aptitude in our students. The committee strives to promote a research friendly environment in the college and to orient the student towards formulating research questions and train them in techniques, which will improve their critical abilities and expand their horizons. Towards this end, summer research internship projects are undertaken by students in which they formulate short proposals that they would research over two months under the guidance of teacher-mentor/s. The college financially supports the projects. In the very first year, 24 research projects were executed in the college. There were 17 projects from the Humanities Department and 7 projects from the four science Departments. After the completion of the projects, they were presented in front of eminent experts who judged the projects on various criteria. The list of projects along with mentors and students are attached as an annexure. The first prize in the Humanities section went to the study entitled “Role of social media in mobilizing collective action against sexual violence: A case study of # Me too movement in the context of India” undertaken by students of Sociology Department. In Science section the project entitled “Relationship between the Molecular properties and relative sweetness of various artificial sweeteners” conducted by students of Chemistry Department was judged as the best project. Another initiative of the committee was the One Day Educational Excursion for all the Departments of the college. Every Department went on a one day educational trip to areas in and around Delhi and submitted reports on their respective studies. The transportation was provided by the college.

AVGAAHAN(Interdisciplinary Fest)

Avgaaahan, the annual interdisciplinary fest was organized from 1st February to 1st March, 2019 by Maitreyi College. It is a unique event that gave a platform to students from across the country and from other countries to unleash their creativity. The sanskrit word, ‘Avgaaahan’ gestures towards an initiation into a new sphere/ an exploration of a novel idea. The deeper we explore a field of inquiry the more enlightening and enriching the experience is. With an emphasis on interdisciplinary activities and research, the college organized various competitions which were two tiered, with both online and offline rounds.

The all pervasive and deeply impactful role of technology can be seen in the fields of teaching, pedagogy and learning processes. The Techfest is a unique and innovative attempt to use technology to bridge distance and the barriers of disciplines. It was heartening to see the overwhelming response of science and commerce students in competitions organized by humanities departments. The phenomenal response of the student community was indicated in the scores of registrations and enthusiastic participation in Avgaaahan.

The 58 winners of various events such as micro fiction, botanical sketching, business plan presentation, quiz etc. were awarded prizes in the valedictory session which was held on 1st March. The Chief Guest for the event was Dr. Payal, the Principal of Shahid Rajguru College and the occasion was graced by Chief Editor, Mr. Rajeev Singh and the Chairperson of the Governing Body, Mr. Sanjay Kansal. Dr. Payal and Mr. Singh began by saluting the valor and spirit of the Indian Defence Forces and encouraged the students to do the same. Mr. Kansal spoke about the potential of the youth and how their perseverance, passion and zeal can make them attain great heights.

SHORT TERM COURSES COMMITTEE

The College runs five short term Certificate courses in French, Spanish, Journalism and Web designing and one Diploma course in Spanish Language.

PLACEMENT CELL

The cell conducted placement drives by some of the most renowned companies including the likes of Ernst and Young, Tresvista, NIIT, Jamboree, FIS, Urbanclap, Infollion, IIFM, Limetray, Knowledge Xp, Deloitte etc. Organised informative seminar session with significant organisations like Niti Aayog, Vedica Scholars, Teach for India, ICOFP, Metvy, Unique Shiksha, IMS, Revatta etc. On an average, more than 10 students per company were placed through on and off campus recruitments. An educational visit was conducted for students via our collaboration with the German Embassy. The first Internship and Placement Fair, Envision was organised to enable students to network with companies, identify potential job opportunities and enhance their professional communication skills. More than 60 companies including Ola, India Bulls, Religare, Decathlon and Times of India participated in the fair. Various NGOs like Pratham, Teach for India and Jagori also offered internships through the fair. Approximately 1400 students registered, out of which 500 students sat for the initial round of interviews. Close to 150 students were offered internship and job opportunities. Salary packages offered by companies ranged from Rs 3- 12 lakhs per annum while the stipends were between Rs 5000-15000 per month.

MERAKI (The Entrepreneurship Cell)

It was founded in the year 2019 with the objective to provide a learning platform to the budding women entrepreneurs of Maitreyi College. The following programs have been successfully completed till now -

- 30 students and 2 teachers Aruna saluja and Nidhi Chand attended a panel discussion and seminar on “Empowering Women through Entrepreneurship” conducted by the National Commission of Women on 31st January at India Habitat Centre. Students got a chance to listen to / interact with Dr. Virendra Kumar, honourable Minister of State, Ministry of Women and child development; Ms Chetna Gala Sinha, Mann Deshi Bank, Ms Sunita Sanghi, Senior Advisor, Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship and many successful women entrepreneurs from all across India.
- 30 students participated in a skill based workshop organized by IE business school based in Spain conducted in college premises on 2nd April. Our college was one of 5 colleges of DU where the workshop was conducted by the business school. There were 30 value proposition canvas’ created by students in the workshop.
- 7 students attended a one day hands on training workshop on “Open data Development Initiatives” conducted by the World Bank’s Public Information Centre conducted on 12th April at The World Bank.

ENABLING UNIT

- Organised National Workshop on “Career Opportunities in the area of Disability (for Non PwD and PwD Students)”. About 100 students from various colleges/universities participated in the workshop. Lecture were delivered by eminent persons from various fields such as media, academy, youth affairs and sports.
- Organised one-week interdisciplinary Faculty Development Programme on “Disabilities Studies : Perspectives and Emerging Trends” at Maitreyi College in collaboration with TLC, Ramanujan College, New Delhi under the Scheme of *PMMMNM*TT, Ministry of HRD, Govt. of India.
- Writer and Reader’s Bank was renewed for session 2018-19. The Unit provided writer facility for UGC-NET Examination to PwD candidates at Maitreyi College Centre.
- The Unit provided separate Room and Invigilator to PwD students as well as needy students in all exams. Dr. Pramod Kumar Singh, Mr. Yogesh Chaurasia and Smt. Smriti Singh have helped to PwD students in Admission Process.

- “Sashakt Nodal Sports Centre” for PwDs (Persons with Disabilities) was started. At the primary stage, Wheelchair Basketball practices started in the College Play Ground in which some National and International players of wheelchair basketball participated.

N.S.S.

- Thirty three NSS volunteers completed their 120 hours of summer internship of Swachata by adopting five villages across India Taraiya Chhapra(Bihar), Jivwana Guliyan(Uttar Pradesh, Near Meerut), Dakpathar(Utrakhand), Digghi(Jharkhand) and Dibrugarh(Assam).
- Participated in the celebration of International Day of Yoga in Maitreyi College as well as at NSS centre, University of Delhi.
- NSS volunteers and other students actively participated in the 4-day meditation camp organized in collaboration with Sahjog organization.

PRAKRITI (Eco Club)

The Eco Club 'Prakriti' of Maitreyi College under the guidance of convener Dr Rina Majumdar organized several activities in the academic session 2018-19. 'Prakriti' of the college remains active throughout the academic session and organizes several workshops, excursions, lectures by eminent scientists that generate awareness on important environmental issues among the students and teachers.

Prakriti organized several competitions like Ecology Quiz, Botanical Identification of Plants, Plant Sketching, Poster Making Competition (Theme: Clean and Green Delhi) in the month of April 2018. Students from various departments participated enthusiastically in all the events. This was followed by an invited lecture by eminent scientist Prof. Dinabandhu Sahoo, Director of Bioresources and Sustainable Development (IBSD), Manipur (Prof, Department of Botany, University of Delhi) on 'Life in Antarctica' where he shared experiences of his Antarctica visit during 1987-88.

The college was awarded with Plastic Free College of the Year Award-2018 on occasion of World Environment Day at National Environment Convention-2018 organized by Indian Institute of Ecology and Environment, New Delhi and National Institute of Cleanliness Education and Research held on 5th-6th June 2018

An educational trip was organized for the B.Sc Botany (H) II year students to Yamuna Biodiversity Park on 8th March 2019. The main aim of the excursion was to allow the students to observe a restored ecosystem and understand native flora and fauna of the area. It also gave them an understanding of the role of bio reserves in conservation and restoration of excessively degraded ecosystem through natural measures.

Faculty members and students of Botany department attended workshops organized by the Department of Environment, Government of NCT of Delhi on "Noise Pollution Control-Silence Speak Volumes" and "Dust control measures at construction sites to control Air pollution". An "Anti-cracker" awareness drive was organized in and around college campus to generate awareness and encourage students to celebrate clean and green Diwali.

All the Science departments of the college organized various competitive events on environment based themes to celebrate the Eco club Fest in the month of March 2019. Students from various courses participated enthusiastically and winners were awarded with prizes and certificates. A One day hands-on training on “Fungal Composting of Garden and Canteen Waste” for students and gardeners was mentored by Dr Livleen Shukla, Scientist, IARI PUSA, New Delhi. This training session helped them to understand the various steps of composting technique for recycling the dry garden and canteen wastes and generate green fertilizer for the college garden.

GARDEN

The College started a garden club – ‘Pristine’ in the current academic year (2018-19). The students of the club were involved in recycling plastic bottles for preparation of waste bins. A ‘Rock Garden’ has been established in the college campus. The college won The ‘Persian Cup’ for ‘Best Garden’ from colleges of Delhi University. An inter-college poster making, collage making, paper reading and online short story writing competitions were held.
