This program was organized to create awareness about the uses of the available e-resources to the students and also to teach them how to access these resources (N-List). They were told about NLIST ("National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content"), its subscription to INDEST-AICTE resources for universities and e-Shodh resources for technical
